Annual Province-Wide Earthquake Drill

Non-Profit Organizations Get Ready to ShakeOut!

At 10:00 a.m. on January 26, 2011, thousands of British Columbians will “Drop, Cover, and Hold On” in *The Great British Columbia ShakeOut*, the largest earthquake drill in BC history! All non-profit organizations are encouraged to participate in the drill (or plan a more extensive exercise).

British Columbia is located in a seismically active region where a few thousand earthquakes occur each year in and adjacent to the province. The threat of a major earthquake in the province is real and all British Columbians must know how to be prepared.

The ShakeOut drill is our chance to practice how to protect ourselves, and for everyone to become prepared. The goal is to prevent disasters from becoming catastrophes.



Why is having a “Drop, Cover, and Hold On” drill important? As with anything, to act quickly you must practice often. You may only have seconds to protect yourself in an earthquake before strong

shaking knocks you down, or before something falls on you.

Everyone can participate! Individuals, families, businesses, schools, government agencies and organizations are all invited to register.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

Plan Your Drill:

- Register at www.shakeoutbc.ca to be counted in the ShakeOut Drill, get email updates, and more.
- Have a “Drop, Cover, and Hold On” drill at 10:00 a.m. on January 26. You can also exercise other aspects of your emergency plan.
- Discuss what you learned and make improvements.

Get Prepared for Earthquakes:

- Check your emergency supplies and equipment; make sure they are accessible and functional.
- Inspect your facilities for items that might fall and cause injury, and secure them.
- Encourage staff, volunteers and clients to prepare at home.
- Provide first aid and response training for staff and volunteers.

Share the ShakeOut:

- Encourage staff and volunteers to ask their friends, families, and neighbors to register.
- Ask colleagues at other organizations to participate.
