Video featuring Jefferson City school children now helping teach Midwest residents what to do during an earthquake

Fourth graders' demonstration of "Drop, Cover, Hold On" has just been adopted by organizers of 11-state earthquake drill on April 28

JEFFERSON CITY – A new earthquake preparedness video featuring Mid-Missouri fourth graders is now being used by the **Central United States Earthquake Consortium** to teach Midwesterners what to do to in the event of an earthquake. The four-minute video was released yesterday by CUSEC, the organizers of the first-ever **Great Central U.S. ShakeOut** earthquake drill, scheduled for 10:15 a.m. on April 28.

More than 172,000 Missourians and almost 1 million central U.S. residents are already registered to participate in the 11-state earthquake drill.

A video featuring teacher Rhonda Allen's fourth-grade class at Jefferson City's Thorpe Gordon Elementary School was photographed by the State Emergency Management Agency in December and posted to the SEMA Web site. The fourth graders do such a strong job demonstrating the Drop, Cover, Hold On method of self-protection that CUSEC commissioned SEMA to adapt the video for all 11 central U.S. states participating in the ShakeOut.

"The fourth graders at Thorpe Gordon really deserve this recognition," said **State Emergency Management Agency Director Paul D. Parmenter**. "The children were enthusiastic, attentive and provided a great example of what to do during an earthquake."

CUSEC coordinates earthquake preparedness for Missouri, Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Mississippi and Tennessee. Georgia, Oklahoma and South Carolina will also participate in the ShakeOut drill.
