The devastation brought by earthquakes throughout the world in the past two years has captured the attention of all central U.S. residents, where earthquakes can happen. Scientists tell us that a damaging earthquake may strike the central U.S. at anytime. You can help prepare central U.S. for that eventuality by broadcasting a 60 second recording for participants to listen to as they practice “drop, cover, and hold on” during the *Great Central U.S. ShakeOut*, the largest earthquake drill in central U.S. history, on April 28, 2011 at 10:15 a.m. (April 19, 2011 at 10:15 a.m. for Indiana)
