On Wednesday, October 23, 2013 at 10:23AM over 107,000 Montanans, including approximately 76,000 K-12 students in public and private schools, participated in the Rocky Mountain ShakeOut, the first annual state earthquake drill. Students, teachers, and administrators dropped, covered, and held on to practice what to do in the event that the ground starts to shake.

Mark your calendars! The 2014 Great Montana ShakeOut will occur on **Wednesday**, **October 22**, **2014** at **10:22AM**. We encourage you to embrace this opportunity as a creative way to complete required emergency preparedness drills and planning at your school or district and prepare for earthquakes, the #3 hazard in Montana according to the State of Montana Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan.

The ShakeOut message is simple, "Drop, Cover, and Hold On." In the school setting, this drill not only educates students on what to do and how to react in case of an earthquake, but also encourages thinking around general emergency preparedness and risk reduction measures.
