

Proclamation

WHEREAS, the state of Washington experiences natural and man-made disasters and scientific evidence indicates that we remain vulnerable, making it important for everyone in our state to prepare themselves to be self-sufficient following a natural, or man-made disaster; and

WHEREAS, individuals, companies, and government agencies should review their preparedness plans, contact information, and emergency kits so that they can provide essential services after a disaster, and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Military Department's Emergency Management Division, with its Great Washington ShakeOut campaign, leads the statewide "Drop, Cover and Hold On Drill" and coastal county "Tsunami Siren Test" to be held in October; and

WHEREAS, emergency preparedness for the upcoming winter season begins with the Take Winter By Storm campaign, which provides information and emphasizes the actions that residents need to take to prepare for winter weather impacts; and

WHEREAS, by participating in the Great Washington ShakeOut and the Take Winter By Storm campaigns, individuals, neighborhoods, schools, businesses, and organizations will take steps to prepare before a disaster strikes; and

WHEREAS, the loss of life and property can be greatly reduced if individuals, government agencies, tribes, schools, hospitals, and businesses are equipped with a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio and use it as a personal all-hazards alert and warning system; and

*WHEREAS*, the NOAA Weather Radio is a complement to local broadcast news and the Internet, providing residents and businesses information on approaching hazards that allows them critical lead time to prepare and to take the appropriate public safety actions before, during, and after events;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Jay Inslee, Governor of the state of Washington, do hereby proclaim October 2016 as
