



The Great Central U.S. ShakeOut Spotlight: *Pulaski County, Kentucky Public School District*

As the central United States is earthquake country, it is important for students, faculty, and staff in K-12 schools to know what to do before, during, and after an earthquake. This is true for childcare centers, classrooms, schools and districts. The Great Central U.S. ShakeOut provides an opportunity for schools to practice these important steps. By practicing now, classrooms and schools can learn how to better prepare themselves for earthquakes and other disasters, reducing the potential risk of injuries and damages to students and staff.

The Pulaski County School System and Science Hill Independent School held an earthquake drill on March 31st at 10:15 as part of the Great Central U.S. Shake Out. Students and staff district wide practiced the Drop, Cover, Hold On approach as recommended by the Kentucky Emergency Management Earthquake Program (KYEM).

County Judge Executive Barty Bullock signed a Proclamation recognizing the importance of preparing our community, reducing the loss of lives and property from a major earthquake event by taking proactive steps today.
