WHAT: 2024 Great Berkeley ShakeOut Earthquake Drill with opportunities to:

- Film live or record interviews inside <u>The Big Shaker</u> 7.0 earthquake simulator. To sign up for a 15 minute time slot to film in The Big Shaker contact Mark Benthien at 213.740.0323.
- Interview scientists about recent seismic activity in California and about the latest in earth quake early warning research.
- Tour the Hayward fault on campus, including the stadium seismic retrofit.
- Film the Berkeley Seismology Lab's staff practicing a live earthquake Drop,
 Cover, Hold On drill, initiated by the <u>MyShake app</u>.
- Speak with subject matter experts about Bay Area earthquake readiness and preparedness.
- Cover the UC Berkeley Preparedness Block Party.

Each year, Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills involve millions of participants worldwide through broad-based outreach programs, media partnerships, and public advocacy by hundreds of partners. The drill is held annually on the third Thursday of October. This year, International ShakeOut Day will be on October 17. However, people and organizations can hold their drills on any other day of the year. Most participants will practice the "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" self-protection guidance, or adapt for their own situations (such as "Lock, Cover, and Hold On" for people who use mobility devices with wheels).
