Annual Statewide Earthquake Drill

## K-12 Schools and Districts

Every year, hundreds of thousands of Utahns “Drop, Cover, and Hold On” in The Great Utah ShakeOut, the state's largest earthquake drill! All K-12 schools and districts are encouraged to participate in the drill (or plan a more extensive exercise).

Major earthquakes may happen anywhere you live, work, or travel. The ShakeOut is our chance to practice how to protect ourselves, and for everyone to become prepared. The goal is to prevent a major earthquake from becoming a catastrophe for you, your organization, and your community.

Why is a “Drop, Cover, and Hold On” drill important? To respond quickly you must practice often. You may only have seconds to protect yourself in an earthquake before strong shaking knocks you down, or something falls on you.



Millions of people worldwide have participated in Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills since 2008. The first Utah ShakeOut was held in 2012 as part of a statewide earthquake response exercise.

### HOW TO PARTICIPATE

#### Plan Your Drill:

- Register at [ShakeOut.org/utah/register](http://ShakeOut.org/utah/register) to be counted as participating, get email updates, and more.
- Download a Drill Broadcast recording from [ShakeOut.org/utah/drill/broadcast](http://ShakeOut.org/utah/drill/broadcast).
- Have a “Drop, Cover, and Hold On” drill. You can also practice other aspects of your emergency plan.
- Discuss what you learned and make improvements.

#### Get Prepared for Earthquakes:

- Check your emergency supplies and equipment; make sure they are accessible and functional.
- Download and review school preparedness materials from [ShakeOut.org/utah/howtoparticipate](http://ShakeOut.org/utah/howtoparticipate).
- Encourage staff and students to prepare at home.
- Distribute ShakeOut take-home materials.

#### Share the ShakeOut:

- Encourage students and staff to ask their friends, families and neighbors to register.
- Ask colleagues at other schools to participate.
